Let's go shopping!



When being ready with just a few simple words and phrases, along with an understanding of "la politesse" – basic rules of French politeness will help shopping a great and helpful experience.

Upon entering a shop: Greet "Bonjour Monsieur/Madame," A sales person is likely to ask you - "Puis-je vous aider?" – "Can I help you?"

- Please... "S'il vous plait.." (Seal-voo-play)
- ...Excuse me. "Excusez-moi." (Es-cue-say mwa)
- I do not speak French. "Je ne parle pas Français." (Juh- nuh parl pa frahnsay.)
- Do you speak English? "Parlez-vous anglais?" (Par-lay vooz ahn-glay?)
- To ask the price of something in French, ask "Combien coûte?"
- While getting ready to leave the store, always smile, say, "Thank you!" "Merci!," and "Good Bye," "Au revoir"
