PREPOSITION DEFINITION




Prepositions are words that show the relationship between a noun

(or pronoun) and other words in a sentence. They often indicate

location, direction, time or manner.









Prepositions of Place



Prepositions of place indicate the specific location or position of a person, object or thing in relation to another. They answer the question "Where?"






Prepositions of Place

Prepositions of Time



Prepositions of time indicate the specific point or duration when something happens. They answer the question "When?"

Prepositions of Direction



Prepositions of direction indicate movement from one place to another or the direction of an action. They answer the question "Where to?" and show where something or someone is moving.
