# The Scheduled Tribes and Other Traditional Forest Dwellers (Recognition of Forest Rights) Act, 2006

- •Recognizes forest rights of Scheduled Tribes (STs) and Other Traditional Forest Dwellers (OTFDs)
- •Grants legal recognition to their land and resources
- •Ensures their right to access, manage, and conserve forests







# Types of Rights under the Act

- •Individual Forest Rights (IFR): Ownership rights to cultivated land
- •Community Forest Rights (CFR): Rights to use, manage, and protect forests
- •Right to Collect Minor Forest Produce: Includes non-timber forest products
- •Right to Protect and Conserve Forests: Ensuring biodiversity conservation







# **Eligibility and Implementation**

- •Scheduled Tribes (STs): Must reside in forests and depend on them before 13 December 2005
- •Other Traditional Forest Dwellers (OTFDs): Must prove 75 years of forest dependence before 2005
- •Implementation Process: Gram Sabha verification, district-level committee approval







# **Challenges in TK and Forest Rights Protection**

- •Lack of legal harmonization
- •Difficulties in defining ownership

- •Ensuring equitable benefit sharing
